A Family Discussion On a Shipboard

The younger son, **Rufus**, said: "I was thinking of this exciting annual trip. It's true that in Cyrene we meet daily, especially in the evenings to pray and read the Bible together, but in Passover we find this wonderful occasion an opportunity for us to be together day and night.

We also take the blessing of the great temple of Jerusalem, which is located in the center of the world between the east and the west. How joyful it is to see the millions of people who come from all over the world to meet as one family. Every year, we meditate on the awesome works of God when He saved our fathers from the slavery of Pharaoh and sent Moses the Prophet and Aaron the High-Priest to lead the people out of Egypt into the wilderness, where Moses received the law and the divine commandments. Rufus:

- "Is God really pleased by the shedding of the blood of thousands of lambs in Passover?

- And why do all these families endure the burden of traveling from all around the world to Jerusalem to present these offerings?
- Can the shedding of these innocent animals' blood reconcile the Holy God who is praised by all the heavenly hosts with humanity on earth that suffers from the deception of the devil, worldly desires and sin?"

Simon answered his son saying: "God's wisdom, dear Rufus, is different from us humans. We consider things from a materialistic point of view, and so we say that the Passover costs Jews millions of pieces of silver. "Father, do you think that the Messiah will be greater than Jesus whom we have been seeing for the last
